Next Sunday will be recognised as Day for Life. This year it is particularly significant as it is 50 years since the 1967 Abortion Act was passed in England, Scotland and Wales. That anniversary in October will be marked in various other ways. Next Sunday will provide us with an opportunity to pray for and remember all lives lost before birth and to offer practical and emotional support to women and men who are worried and concerned about an unexpected pregnancy. While abortion springs readily to mind when issues of Life are raised it is important to remember other threats that exist: suicide, euthanasia, embryo experimentation. There is a mystery at the heart of each of us that cannot be reduced to our place in society or the talents or qualities we happen to have. Christians express this mystery by saying that every human being has a spiritual 'soul' directly created by God. We should always think of soul and life together as in the phrase 'the life and soul of the party'. The soul is not something extra added to human life, but is what moves and shapes that life. The human being is neither merely a physical body nor merely a ghost living inside a body. The human being is a living whole, a unity of body and soul. This unity is the foundation of many rights, for instance, the right to religious freedom. People need to express their spiritual lives in bodily ways, through actions, words and gestures, as in the words of Scripture 'use your body for the glory of God'.
