Archbishop Longley has commissioned a review of the current safeguarding/child protection practices in the diocese in the light of the National Catholic Policies and Procedures. This review is being conducted by an independent charity called SCIE (Social Care Institute for Excellence). As part of the review, SCIE would like to speak with any individuals who have had experience with safeguarding issues within the Archdiocese, and have experience of working with our parish safeguarding representatives and the safeguarding team at

The present church of St Francis was built in 1870 and opened on the feast of the saint, 4th October. It replaced an earlier church on the same site. This means that in 2020 the church building will be 150 years old. To celebrate this, it is hoped to re-decorate the church and to restore some of the decoration that was removed in the 1960s. A decorative scheme is being worked on and it is hoped that it will be available by the spring of next year. At the same time, we need to decide if we wish to mark the sesquicentennial in other ways – a parish dinner or lunch, a novena of prayer before the actual date, a parish mission, a pilgrimage to Assisi, or something else. We need to start making plans now, so if you can think of anything, please make known your ideas.
