Pope St Gregory I

St Gregory, also known as The Great, was Pope of the Catholic Church between 590 and 604 AD. He was born around 540 in Rome

His great, great grandfather was Pope Felix III who reigned from 483-492 (at a time before clergy took vows of celibacy)

Gregory's family were very wealthy and owned estates on the Island of Sicily, which provided income.

He was only 2 years old when the plague (black death) swept through the region. The disease was responsible for killing a third of the population in Italy.

Gregory excelled at his studies and became an expert at law. He excelled so much that he became The Perfect of Rome, at the age of 33. Pope Gregory made many changes to the Mass, some of which remain today. The position of the Our Father in the Mass remains where Pope Gregory placed it. He was also well known for his alms to the poor.
