THE WORD THIS WEEK

We missed the beginning of the Sermon on the Mount last week, but the psalm response *How happy are the poor in spirit, theirs is the kingdom of heaven* is a guide to the whole year of Matthew: everything is footnotes to this. The Gospel today is another portrayal of how we should live, as Jesus dignifies us with two extraordinary titles: the salt of the earth and the light of the world. The first reading is about what is true fasting - not hanging your head and looking sorrowful, but 'sharing your food with the hungry...' and so on. Do these things and your light will shine out. The psalm carries on seamlessly from this. So we have been told: being holy in private is not enough. We must be seen to do all these things and not hide our lamp under a tub.
