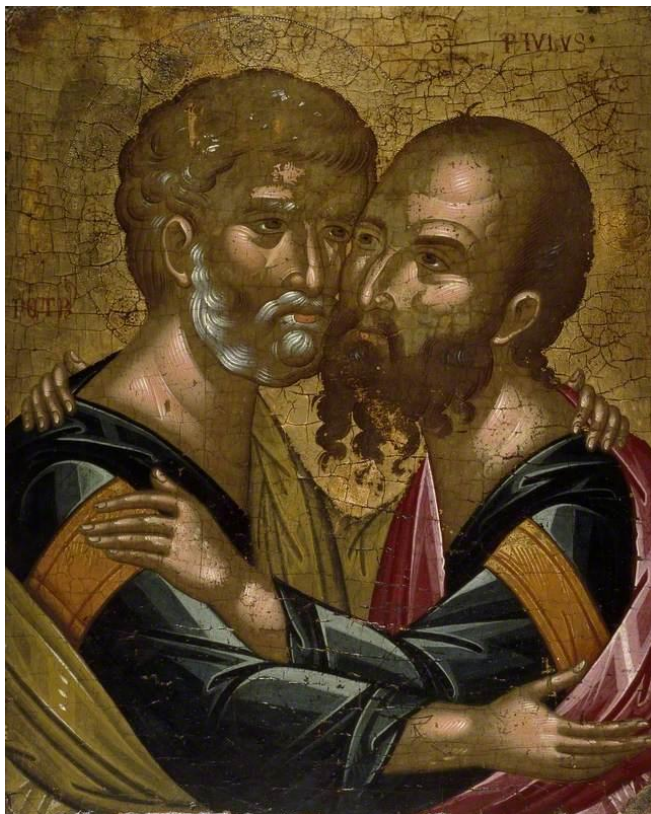

THE WORD THIS WEEK

Peter and Paul are the two great heroes of the Apostolic Age - Peter for leading the first Christian communities and binding them in unity, a role that springs from his profession of faith in Caesarea Philippi, and Paul for travelling throughout the Roman Empire as the Apostle to the Gentiles, ensuring that the Gospel could be heard by all. They both ended up in Rome, the heart of the Empire, where they crowned their lives of witness by shedding their blood for Christ. As the ancient hymn for this feast day (“Decora Lux aeternitatis”) says:

*“Rejoice, O Rome, this day; thy walls they once did sign
With princely blood, who now their glory share with thee.
What city’s vesture glows with crimson deep as thine?
What beauty else has earth that may compare with thee?”*

In celebrating the death of these apostles and martyrs, we celebrate the triumph of life and death offered fully to God.



GENERAL NOTICES

Guidelines for the resumption of Mass: The rules below* for visiting the church will equally apply to attendance at Mass.

There is **no Sunday obligation**

Please avail yourself of coming to a **weekday Mass** instead of Sunday to help even out the numbers. Admittance will be on a first come first served basis.

The wearing of **masks** will be required due to social distancing being reduced to 1m+

Please only sit where you see a **blue dot**. These will be stuck at the ends of alternate benches.

Please only use the **end of each bench**. A single person at each end or a couple at each end but no one in between. Please don't climb over anyone to get into a bench.

A family can take up a whole bench but no one else is to share that bench. Please allow yourselves to be directed by the stewards.

There are **no toilet facilities** until the end of the pandemic. Please plan accordingly.

There will be **no paper copies** of the newsletter. Please find the newsletter on the website and download it or print it off at home. Please don't bring it to church.

Collection: Please continue giving as you have been. Contactless payment will be coming

Readings: Please bring your own missal or use the QR code for the readings. There will be no Mass books (St Charles) or missalettes (St Mary)

Holy Communion: The distribution of Holy Communion will be different in both churches. Please allow yourselves to be directed by the stewards.

***When visiting the church for private prayer:**

Wash your hands beforehand.

Wear a mask

Use the sanitizer provided when entering & leaving the church.

Keep apart from people you don't live with.

Follow the one-way system.

Don't touch surfaces except where you sit.

The toilets are out of use.

Ask one of the stewards if you need to use the side entrance at St Mary Immaculate.
