***Whose Faith Is It Anyway?***

Since 1 March 2020, St Anne's Wappenbury and Our Lady of the Angels Chapel has, for the most part, remained closed for public Mass. Neither has opened fully since then. There is a sadness about this that cannot be ignored just as the expectation now of a pathway out of lock down fills us with hope. Our hope is of a return to a sense of 'normality' about the lived faith that is ours. Yet it is important to remember that our return must not contain the "pre existing conditions" that, in the past 30 years, has led to a decline in Catholic worship, the closure of many churches and the clustering of parishes – and the potential of depriving another generation of the blessings of our rich Catholic heritage.

When the Sunday obligation to attend Mass is restored, as it inevitably will be, I do not expect a rush back to Mass nor an increase in membership of the Catholic Church, not because people have become accustomed to the comfort of streamed Mass at home - we cannot blame the pandemic for the ailments that have inflicted the church for many years. There still remain some "pre-existing conditions" that predispose the church to further possible decline (of which more in the weeks ahead). I am certain and optimistic that our time 'away' and our time experiencing worship in a new way may have whetted appetites to know, to experience more and to share more.

Between now and the end of lock down, I will invite preparation for a "new normal", one in which the transmission of our faith from this generation to the next will be our "new normal". This implies that this current generation of adults and older teenagers – that means you - be 'evangelised'. This means that all will devote time and energy to developing a personal relationship with Jesus Christ. It is this relationship *alone* that will provide the vaccine to prevent another generation being inflicted with the malaise that is current in many places. We must not permit a "new normal" to be very old, else we may soon succumb to further malaise and apathy.

As is the case with very much involved in Covid 19 lock down, much of the burden of faith transmission seems to fall heavily on women, whether mothers or grandmothers. This is wholly wrong. It must not continue to be the case. Faith poverty in a younger generation is a product of faith poverty in adults. Men, proud of their faith inheritance, are needed. Pope Francis is sharp when he describes the church as being like a "field hospital", one committed to those on the edge, one where each has responsibility for all and all accept responsibility for each other.

The witness of those who attend Mass on line offers such encouragement as not to be ignored. It also invites - indeed demand - that we do not presume to offer the same 'diet' as in previous years. A "new normal church" should be different, must be different, will be different - or else let's not bother. Otherwise what will surely emerge is a new "variant" of malaise and apathy – and a 'vaccine to this may be difficult to find!

I am excited about the future of our rural parish in Wappenbury. It is acknowledged as being among the 'founders' of the Catholic Church in Midlands England after the Reformation. There is a real pride in recalling that, during those years of prohibition, Mass was celebrated at St Anne's without interruption. We can be similarly proud that throughout the Covid 19 Mass has been celebrated almost daily. This will continue as we prepare to re-present opportunities for a renewed sacramental life. And a new way of being "church".

Opportunities are being presented to us not just to stem the tide of departures from the Catholic community but rather to enhance it and to respond to the heartfelt plea of Pope Francis for a "New Evangelisation". Next week, I will present some details to bring this about and these will require your participation.

### **Sacraments During Pandemic**

You are aware now that we are deprived of the sacraments during the pandemic. While this will continue for some time yet, we must nevertheless prepare for the reception of the sacraments. Preparation for each sacrament will be conducted on line. This pandemic can really be a new God-given invitation to approach our traditional practices in an altogether new and life-giving way.

**Baptism:** if you have a child/children for baptism and if you have already contacted Fr Teddy, you will receive a reply early next week with suggestions as to how we will proceed. I will follow closely the guidelines and plan on exit from lock down proposed by the Prime Minister last week.

**First Holy Communion:** If you have a child/children whom you consider to be ready to receive their First Holy Communion, please contact Fr Teddy this week. Neither age nor class in school determines an appropriate time for a child's First Holy Communion. This is determined by the child's and family's readiness for the sacrament. I have, to date, received contact from only one parent.

**Confirmation:** If you wish to be prepared for the Sacrament of Confirmation, please contact Fr Teddy this week. For those being prepared through Princethorpe College, you will be informed by your Chaplaincy Team as soon as it becomes safe to administer the sacrament.

**Marriage:** If you are considering getting married in 2021 or 2022 and you have not heard from Fr teddy recently, please get in touch this week.

### **A Time To Sit With Your Friend This Week**

Since we cannot come to church, perhaps we can experience the church in our own homes during the weeks of Lent.

During Wednesdays in Lent I will expose the Blessed Sacrament between 7.00pm and 8.00 pm in the Prayer Room at Wappenbury. I moved the time from 6om – 7pm to 7pm -8pm to avoid clashing with meal times. Let me know what best suits you. I will use Facebook to stream this for you as I do for Mass. There will be no formal prayer. It is for you take as much time as you wish to be with the Lord and to converse with (and listen to) God.

A simple prayer at 7.55pm and a blessing will end this time in prayer

### **A Scripture Reading Programme For The Weeks Of This Lock Down**

I wonder if you have managed to read any of the bible books suggested for Lent reading. With five weeks of Lent remaining, you might try the Gospel of Marc this week (a no frills account of the ministry of Jesus). Then move to the Acts of the Apostles (sort of history of the early church and the spread of Christianity). Jump back then to the Book of Job (an interesting and challenging look at our relationship with God when things do not work out as we expected). For limited ages: **between 7 and 100!!**

### **Re-Opening Of Our Churches And Receiving Communion**

The prime Minister's plan of last week presents some hopeful guideline for the re-opening of St Anne's Church. I will study the various stages and I will try to respond as speedily as possible. My judgment remains that to stay shut for public gatherings is the safest approach for us all. Should you wish a time of quiet prayer in St Anne's please get in touch with me.

I am looking at ways to have the services commence at Princethorpe College at least for Holy Week, beginning on Palm Sunday. Our Lady of the Angels Chapel at Princethorpe will remain closed for the present time. I will keep you informed as matters improve and as the roll out of vaccine proceeds

Daily Mass will continue to be streamed at 9.30am each day from the prayer room at Wappenbury. Can you join the community for one weekday Mass during the weeks of Lent and, perhaps, invite someone to attend with you?

The obligation to attend Sunday Mass remains suspended.
