THE WORD THIS WEEK

In Mark's Gospel the first day of Jesus' ministry takes place on the Sabbath. He wants to restore our freedom and the original blessing of that first Sabbath; the Paradise of the Garden of Eden which was lost after the Fall. We're told he takes Simon's mother-in-law by the hand and helped her up. She wasn't just helped up in order to carry on as before though. She was raised to new life in the Kingdom where all are called to a life of service: to the Lord and to our fellow brothers and sisters.

Saint of the Week **St Scholastica (480 - 547)**

Scholastica was the sister of St. Benedict of Nursia and is revered as the patron saint of Benedictine nuns. She is said to have established a convent at Piumarola in Italy, in accordance with the principles of the monastic rule established by her brother at nearby Monte Cassino. Artistic representations often depict her as a youthful Benedictine abbess, wearing black and holding in her hand a book or a dove. Everything that is known of her comes from the *Dialogues* of Gregory the Great who describes a meeting between the siblings and the subsequent death of Scholastica.
