Dear Parishioners,

On behalf of all the Priests I would like to thank you for your cards and gifts and wish you a very Happy and Holy Easter.

This year Lent feels as if it began on the first day of Lockdown. The Liturgical date of Ash Wednesday was on the 17th February and the long month of March seemed to take forever until the sun came out last week. Now we look forward with hope to a new future, conscious of the chaos which still remains in the countries around us where the Coronavirus Pandemic is a serious problem. For many of our Parishioners this means they cannot return home to visit their parents, family members, relations and friends. Even in this country we are ever conscious of the responsibilities of everybody to take great care to avoid contracting or spreading the virus.

This is why I believe the approach of the Church to enable worship, prayer and the celebration of Sacraments has to be within the bounds of common sense. At our 3 churches in Catholic Leamington we are blessed with space but some smaller churches in the Deanery do not have the room to enable a Congregation to gather safely or the Priest may still be vulnerable. There are many reasons why in some churches Masses and Services have not begun.

For the foreseeable future our priority is the health and safety of our Parishioners and visitors so we may not see any changes to the limits on the number of people who can attend Mass at the present time. Many who have been shielding for months will find it difficult to return and I am thinking about ways of helping those Parishioners who still feel vulnerable.

In the meantime as people want to return we shall need to think about more Masses or as the Bishops have pointed out attendance at any Mass during the week fulfils our Weekly Obligation (or at home if this is the only option.)

As a parish our need is to reach out to those who do not have the technology to be with us. I know school PTAs have raised money to purchase computers for pupils, perhaps this is something we might consider for our Parishioners and/or help them to understand the technology. We have to think outside the box!

We look towards the next few months with hope and a sense of confidence conscious of our need to play safe.

Many I wish you all a very Happy and Holy Easter.
