

The Word this Week

The Gospel reading today depends on recalling the Road to Emmaus story from Year A. It is another account of the events of the Gospel last week; we are still on the day of the Resurrection and the two Emmaus disciples, after recognising Jesus, had set out 'that instant' to tell the others what they had seen. Suddenly Jesus appears among them. which initially produces alarm, but Jesus makes the gesture to all of them which he only made to Thomas in John's account look at my hands and feet... touch for yourselves. He then eats with them, and finally explains the scriptures to them, opening their minds, and promises that repentance would be preached to all the nations.


