THE WORD THIS WEEK

Saint Osburg (-1018)

Saint Osburg was the first Abbess of a monastery founded at Coventry by King Canute at the beginning of the 11th century. She died around 1018. Although nothing else is known about her, there was a strong cult to St Osburg in Coventry during the Middle Ages. In the 19th century revival of Catholicism, Bishop Ullathorne dedicated the first Catholic Church in the city to her. Sept 9 is the date when Bishop Wiseman consecrated the new Church of St Osburg in Coventry in 1845.
